1 St Barnabas Cathedral


Derby Road, Nottingham NG1 5AE

The Grade II* listed Roman Catholic Cathedral designed by renowned Victorian architect Augustus Welby Pugin, and restored to its original Gothic splendour. Full disabled access.

2 Nottingham Playhouse


Wellington Circus, off Derby Road, Nottingham NG1 5AF

Tour of Nottingham's innovative 1960s theatre - one of the earliest and most highly regarded post-war provincial theatres, designed by Peter Moro. This is a listed building. Full disabled access.

Step inside this historic independent library often described as Nottingham's best-kept secret. Founded in 1816 the library occupies the upper rooms of a Georgian town house, and enjoys a city centre garden. No disabled access.


9 The Park Walk


10 Scimitar Cars


11 Behind the Scenes Museum Tour


16 The Adams Building






17 St Mary's Church


High Pavement, Lace Market, Nottingham NG1 1HN

21 Sneinton Hermitage Caves


Sneinton Hermitage, Sneinton, Nottingham NG2 4BS


26 The Rock Chapel of St Mary

28 Highfields Park






33 Rock Cemetery Walk
